HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT PARKING PASS APPLICATION

Va. Code § 22.1-205.1: Each public high school shall require any student who applies to obtain a pass to park a vehicle on school property to provide evidence that the student possesses a valid driver's license or driver privilege card. The Department of Education shall develop, and each public high school shall utilize, a standard application form for students to use to obtain a pass to park a vehicle on school property.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Teen Driving Restrictions

Virginia's driving restrictions are not meant to penalize teen drivers, but to help them stay safe while they gain valuable driving experience. Studies have found that these restrictions work to reduce the number of car crashes among young drivers.

Curfew Restrictions

If you are under age 18, Virginia law prohibits you from driving between midnight and 4 A.M. except when driving:

- to or from a place of business where you are employed;
- to or from an activity that is supervised by an adult and is sponsored by a school or by a civic, religious, or public organization;
- with a licensed spouse age 18 or older, parent or other adult acting in loco parentis who is occupying the front passenger seat,
- in case of an emergency, including responding to emergency calls as a volunteer firefighter or rescue squad personnel.

Restrictions on the Number of Passengers

If you are under age 18, you may carry only one passenger under age 21, unless accompanied by a licensed parent, or other adult acting in place of a parent, in the front passenger seat. However, after you have held your license for one year, you may carry up to three passengers under age 21 in the following situations:

- Travel to and from a school-sponsored activity;
- A licensed driver 21 or older is in the front passenger seat; or
- In case of an emergency.

Learner's permit holders may not carry more than one passenger under age 18.
(Passenger restrictions do not apply to family members)

Cellular Telephone Restrictions

§ 46.2-818.2. Virginia's cellular telephone law prohibits any person from holding a handheld personal communications device while driving a moving motor vehicle on the highways in the Commonwealth.

I understand that Hanover County School Board Regulation 7-4.6 requires that, as a condition for a parking permit, I must agree in writing to allow school officials to exercise their authority to search my vehicle if they have reasonable cause to believe it contains a prohibited substance, a weapon, or any other dangerous or illegal item.

I understand that the owner and/or operator of the vehicle is responsible for seeing that vehicles are properly inspected, insured, and meet all state and local licensing requirements.

I understand administration has the right to revoke the student's parking permit for various attendance issues (including tardies and class cuts), other disciplinary issues, and reasons as listed on the back.

Regulations for Student Parking and Use of Vehicles

1. Seniors are eligible to purchase a parking permit if they have paid the senior class dues. Juniors and sophomores are eligible to purchase a parking permit if all other required fees are also paid and if space is available. The cost for a permit is \$75.00 and may be purchased online or from the financial secretary upon completing the registration form including the owner's signature. (Driver's license and vehicle registration must be presented at time of purchase.) Students who park on campus must have their parking permit displayed. Parking permits are non-transferable. Any vehicle parked on school grounds must have a permit displayed and be parked in a legal space. Violations will result in the vehicle being towed at the owner's expense. Permits may be revoked for reckless and/or improper driving.
2. As a condition for obtaining a permit to park a vehicle on school grounds, a student and the student's parent, if they are the owner of the vehicle, must agree, in writing, to allow school officials to search the vehicle if a school official has reasonable cause to believe that the student has a prohibited substance, a weapon, or any other dangerous or illegal item in the vehicle.
3. Student motor vehicles are not to be moved or otherwise used during the school day without permission from the school office. In addition, students are not permitted to go to their cars during the school day without approval from an administrator.
4. Hanover County Public Schools is not responsible for vehicular or property damage and/or theft on school grounds.
5. Students shall not sit in motor vehicles, nor shall they congregate around at any time during the school day.
6. Upon request of the principal or designee, motor vehicle keys may be required to be turned in to the principal's office each day upon arrival at school.
7. Under certain circumstances, principals will have the right to revoke the student's parking permit for attendance issues including excessive tardies or class cuts, other disciplinary issues, failure to display permit, use of permit on an unauthorized vehicle, excessive speed on school property, etc.
8. Students parking their vehicles on school grounds shall park in designated parking areas only.
9. All motor vehicles parked on school grounds shall have a valid registration as required by the State of Virginia.
10. Students driving on campus must observe a 15 mph speed limit, obey all one-way signs and fire lanes, and keep the volume of music to a minimum.
11. Additional regulations regarding the use of motor vehicles by students may be implemented by the principal as deemed necessary to maintain a safe school campus.
